Safeguarding Procedures

Remember to tell the designated safeguarding lead teachers straight away. You may be asked to record what the child has said on one of our RED safeguarding forms.

Please do not use your mobile phone when working with children. Please do not share personal information with the children. This is for your own safety. Thank you.

Behaviour of Adults and Children

As part of our school ethos, all adults speak kindly and sensitively to children. We are here to care for and nurture them. If you see a child upset, distressed, hurt or crying, please inform a member of staff immediately.

Fire Safety

Please ensure you know where the nearest fire exits are. If the fire alarm sounds, then please leave the school by the nearest exit. The fire assembly point is at the back of the main playground, by the jungle gym.

Health and Safety

All staff and visitors are responsible for health and safety within the school. If you see anything that is unsafe, then please report it immediately to a member of staff.

If you need any first aid assistance then please contact the office for assistance, no matter how small you may feel it might be.

Please ensure you sign into school and wear your visitor's badge at all times. This will ensure you are accounted for during any evacuation procedures.
