SEND areas of need

Many children require additional support at some stage in their educational journey, this does not necessarily mean they are identified as having an SEND.

Children with special educational needs or disabilities (SEND), that make it difficult for them to access the curriculum alongside their peers, may need extra support because of a range of needs. There are four categories of need defined by the SEND Code of Practice 2015:

- Cognition and Learning
- Communication and Interaction
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health
- Physical and/or Sensory

Steps to supporting your child



Class Teacher

To discuss the progress and attainment of your child or to find out what (if any) additional support they are receiving, your first port of call should be their **class teacher**. They will implement class based support and strategies and review the impact termly.

"All teachers are teachers of children with special educational needs or disabilities" (SEND Code of Practice, 2015)



SENCO & Family Engagement Leader (FEL)

In some cases the SENCO may be involved in assisting the class teacher if your child requires support that goes above and beyond Quality First Teaching and classroom based strategies or if outside agencies are required to be involved.
