

PPE, Hygiene and Crisis Management of Unwell Persons

The following outlines the steps that the school will be going through to support PPE, Hygiene and how crisis management will be followed in the event someone becomes unwell onsite during Covid-19 pandemic.

Cleaning: Decide what an enhanced	Cleaning Schedule:

	PE and Lunchtime Sanitation: between PE lessons in the hall and between year group sittings for lunch, all equipment will be fully sanitised
	Afterschool PM: All staff will wash all cleanable equipment/toys with disinfectant. All areas used in the school will be 'deep cleaned'.
Hygiene: Decide the approach to enhance hygiene (for example toilet use, hand washing) and decide on policy related to usually share items (books, toys, practical equipment)	Handwashing timetable is implemented. This has been in place since March 2020. All stakeholders are aware.
	Cleaning product location is known by all relevant staff and is safely stored.
	Hand washing facilities are available within each classroom (sink or sanitizer) A practical routine for regular hand washing is in place and staff, pupils and families understand it (Parent Guide provided Friday 22 nd May 2020)
Plan the school level response should someone fall ill on site	STEP 1 Person to be isolated immediately, 2m distancing to be obtained if possible
	Location for Isolation: Meeting Room
	Adults to staff this area: Paediatric First Aider – Mrs Adams, DHT – Miss Barnett, HT – Miss Hately
	STEP 2 PPE will be provided for the member of staff to wear but will be at the member of staff's discretion where they choose to wear this. Gloves Disposable Apron Mask
	STEP 3 Child is sent home Member of staff does not need to self isolate unless they develop symptoms. The household of the child with symptoms are to self isolate for 14days and the child must isolate for a minimum of 10days if symptoms persist or if the test is positive.
	Testing Staff and children should be immediately tested if they develop symptoms. Positive Test = 10days isolation Negative Test = immediate return to work/School
