

Learning at Joydens Wood

What is Child Initiated Play (CIP) in EYFS

- Learning is chosen and directed by the children
- Children have the freedom to choose what they play with as well as how and when.
- Our EYFS environment (inside and out) is strategically designed to cover all areas of the EYFS Curriculum.
- Adults monitor the learning that is happening and initiate conversation and carefully tailored questioning to explore and develop the learning opportunity
- CIP nurtures the natural curiosity and creativity of every child
- It empowers children to take the lead in their learning journey, fostering independence, confidence, decision-making and a lifelong love for exploration and discovery
- Promotes problem-solving and critical thinking











Our Curriculum

Allows the children to develop **independence** and **expertise** through a succinctly planned **Progression of Skills and Knowledge**.

Every element is <u>carefully considered</u> so the children have a strong grasp of how their prior knowledge enables them to be successful in their future learning.

Our Curriculum is designed to ensure our children have a progressive educational journey that enables them to:

- Develop <u>strong fluency</u> and <u>confidence</u> in the foundations in English and Mathematics
- <u>Lead their own learning</u> through child-led (in the early years) and enquiry-based opportunities in a broad and balanced curriculum.







SEND

At Joydens Wood, we follow a <u>5 Step Plan for SEND concerns</u>.

- Step 1- Quality First Teaching
- Step 2- SEN Clinic discussion with Inclusion Lead reasonable adjustments
- Step 3- Whole School Provision & Interventions
- Step 4- 6 weeks to try the recommendations and review
- Step 5- Referrals to outside agencies (e.g., Local Inclusion Forum Team, Speech and Language Team, Occupational Therapists, Educational Psychologist, Pediatrician)

If a child's provision is above and beyond <u>Quality First Teaching</u> then a <u>Personalised Plan</u> is implemented to outline specific interventions, strategies and resources. This is reviewed with Class Teacher and parents every 6 weeks.

<u>Interventions</u> we offer at our school are: Drawing and Talking, Sensory Circuits, BEAM, Clever fingers, Phonics, Social Skills, Size of the Problem or Zones of Regulation.

We have a <u>whole school approach</u> to visuals. All classrooms have a consistent visual timetable, now and next board, emotions chart and labeled resources with pictures and words.

Our pastoral aim is to equip children to understand who they are, to be healthy, happy and caring people.

There is a strong emphasis on emotional wellbeing and mental health.

- Applying for our school applications open 5th November
 2024 15th January 2025
- Preschool visits undertaken by our EYFS Lead and Inclusion Lead (where required)

- Home visits in September
- Allocated a Year 2 Buddy in September who sits with them at lunch in their first few days

Transition into Year 3

- Applying for our school applications open 5th November 2024 15th January 2025
- You have to apply via the Kent admissions website but the NEST policy states that all Infant School children are guaranteed a place in the Junior School.
- Transition afternoons w/c 7th July where Year 2 get to spend two afternoons with their new Year 3 class teachers and getting to know the school.
- They get a Year 6 buddy
- Year 2 and Year 3 teachers meet during Term 6 to begin a handover all data is shared with new class teachers.
- SENDCos meet with parents to discuss transition too.
- Year 2 watch the Year 6 end of year production.
- Parent Information Evening in summer term organised for you to see the classes and meet the Year 3 team.



Frequently Asked Questions

What is the catchment area?

We don't have one – unless we are over subscribed.

How many classes do we have?

3 classes per year group. Class sizes have capacity for 30.

Do the children get homework?

EYFS: all children receive a reading book

KS1: all children receive a reading book and weekly spellings

KS2: all children receive a reading book, weekly spellings, times tables, 1 x English and

1 x Maths homework on a weekly basis

• Do we go on school trips?

Yes – each year group will go on additional trips that link in with the term's learning. This can be somewhere in the local area or further afield. We also organise 'experiences' throughout the year where special guests attend the school site e.g. Pantomime, Fantastic Fred, Wonderdome

How do we cater for food allergies?

At the Infants, Mrs. Quinn (Catering Business Manager) meets parents to discuss the needs. Where necessary Risk Assessments and Health Care Plans are implemented, reviewed and updated regularly. We have an open dialogue to ensure you are kept informed. The same process at the Junior School with the school staff and the catering team.

- What after school clubs are on offer?

- Do you offer any wrap-around care?
 Joydens Wood breakfast and after school club are located in the Junior School hall, this opens at 7am and pick-up is until 6pm. Infant children are collected by the wrap-around care team and walked over to the Junior School.
